A RESOLUTION

Establishing a task force to develop criteria and procedures for 1 data submission, verification and collection to address 2 insufficient sample data and to assure and disclose that the sample data relied on to develop a county's performance measures during a reassessment is representative of the bulk of the county's property inventory. 6 WHEREAS, At the direction of the House of Representatives through House Resolution 334 of 2009, the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee (LBFC) prepared a report on Pennsylvania's 10 System for Property Valuation and Reassessment and issued the 11 report in 2010; and 12 WHEREAS, The report includes a number of recommendations to 13 enhance the current system, including the development of 14 criteria and procedures for data submission by the county to the 15 State Tax Equalization Board and verification by the State Tax 16 Equalization Board to address insufficient sample data and to 17 assure and disclose that the sample data relied on to develop a 18 county's performance measures during a reassessment is 19 representative of the bulk of the county's property inventory; 20 and

- 1 WHEREAS, According to the LBFC report, the appraisal
- 2 performance measures published by the State Tax Equalization
- 3 Board are used by: taxpayers and local governments in property
- 4 assessment appeals, the Department of Revenue for certain State
- 5 realty transfer taxes and the courts when considering county
- 6 assessment uniformity; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Despite this, the State Tax Equalization Board has
- 8 not been charged or provided the necessary resources to assure
- 9 that data used to develop the measures are consistently reported
- 10 by all counties and are representative of the bulk of the
- 11 county's property inventory, both sold and unsold properties;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, County property inventories are substantially
- 14 different and the differences currently are not taken into
- 15 account in the development of a county's performance measures;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, When a county begins the process of a countywide
- 18 reassessment, the initial step is to collect data on the current
- 19 value of all property within the county. It is important that
- 20 this initial level of data be accurate in order for the rest of
- 21 the reassessment process, and any future use of this data, to be
- 22 fair and equitable; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Data collection criteria and procedures vary between
- 24 data collectors within a county and are also different from
- 25 county to county, thus making it difficult for the political
- 26 subdivisions and the Commonwealth to compare accurate property
- 27 values from within a county and when comparing counties;
- 28 therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives appoint a task
- 30 force to develop criteria and procedures for data submission by

- 1 the county to the State Tax Equalization Board and verification
- 2 by the State Tax Equalization Board to address insufficient
- 3 sample data and to assure and disclose that the sample data
- 4 relied on to develop a county's performance measures during a
- 5 reassessment is representative of the bulk of the county's
- 6 property inventory; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the membership of the task force be made up
- 8 of:
- 9 (1) two members of the House of Representatives or their
- 10 designees, one appointed by the Majority Leader and one
- appointed by the Minority Leader;
- 12 (2) two members of the House of Representatives or their
- designees consisting of the chair and minority chair of the
- 14 House Local Government Committee;
- 15 (3) two members of the House of Representatives or their
- designees consisting of the chair and minority chair of the
- 17 House Finance Committee;
- 18 (4) two appointees from each of the memberships listed
- in this paragraph from a list submitted by each membership,
- one appointed by the Majority Leader and one appointed by the
- 21 Minority Leader:
- 22 (i) the State Tax Equalization Board;
- 23 (ii) the Department of Revenue;
- 24 (iii) the Assessors' Association of Pennsylvania;
- 25 and
- 26 (iv) the County Commissioners Association of
- 27 Pennsylvania;
- 28 and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the task force utilize the staff of the
- 30 Standing Committee on Local Government and the Standing

- 1 Committee on Finance in consultation with and assistance from
- 2 the Local Government Commission and the Legislative Budget and
- 3 Finance Committee; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the task force be charged with developing
- 5 criteria and procedures for data submission by the county to the
- 6 State Tax Equalization Board and verification by the State Tax
- 7 Equalization Board to address insufficient sample data and to
- 8 assure and disclose that the sample data relied on to develop a
- 9 county's performance measure during a reassessment is
- 10 representative of the bulk of the county's property inventory;
- 11 and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the task force be charged with developing
- 13 criteria and procedures for data collection by those individuals
- 14 or organizations conducting the collection of the data to
- 15 determine the current value of properties and real estate within
- 16 a county and providing that data to the county assessor,
- 17 including the viability of creating a uniform training program
- 18 for individuals and organizations collecting the data that is
- 19 provided to the county assessor; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the task force report its results and present
- 21 its findings to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives
- 22 no later than six months after the adoption of this resolution.
