
- About half of PA municipalities use state police for public safety


- Measuring local police presence using budget data
 - \$0 police spending \rightarrow no local police / fully state police coverage
 - > \$0 police spending \rightarrow *some* local police / *not* fully state police coverage




Trends in Coverage



Trends in Coverage




Fiscal Effects of Transitions

• Effect on revenue from fines and fees



- Evidence suggests no impact on total revenues when municipalities voluntarily switch
 - Obviously does not imply local police is costless
- Some impact on revenue from fines and fees
 - Any lost fines/fees revenue likely offset by other sources
